Goals and Objectives

Goal

It is believed that a well-equipped Campus TV can provide students a platform to experience life-wide learning. Through the process of program production, students can not only have stronger bi-literate and tri-lingual abilities but also develop better creativity, interpersonal skills, planning skills, leadership skills and logical thinking to become more confident youngsters.

Objectives

- i. To enhance students' bi-literate and trilingual abilities
- ii. To foster students' civic responsibility, ethical attitude and commitment in the community, enhancing students' creative and innovative capabilities
- iii. To enhance students' sense of belonging to the College and promote a better and healthy relationship between teachers and students
- iv. To enhance the development of students' multiple intelligences and potential

Targets / expected number of beneficiaries

- (i) Students: around 800 students will be watching programs made by Campus TV
- (ii) Teachers: around 65 teachers will be assisted by the Campus TV Team
- (iii) Parents: around 1 600 parents will be watching programs made Campus TV
- (iv) Alumni: alumni will be updated with school news and have a better connection with school through programs produced

1. Background of the College

HKMA David Li Kwok Po College is a DSS school established in 2000. Our mission is to provide a well-rounded education for the total development of our students, encompassing moral, intellectual, physical, social and aesthetic aspects. The College believes that each student has worth and is endowed with potential and that the school can and should develop its students to the fullest. The College also believes that every child has talent and we should nurture each of them to become an effective and independent learner.

Over the past few years, the College has been emphasizing the development of students' being bi-literate and tri-lingual, with confidence and competence to communicate effectively in a global community; well-versed in the use of information technology both within and outside the classroom; logical, independent and creative thinkers who possess the resourcefulness to make sound decisions; well-prepared for continuous and active life-long learning; and cultured and able to appreciate and enjoy both visual and performing arts. To further apply information technology in education, the College has been actively refining IT infrastructure and facilities, various platforms and resources banks. Campus TV is a platform we believe can help us achieve such goals.

2. Internal demand for a well-equipped Campus TV

2.1 To enhance the effectiveness of teaching and learning

The College designs curriculum not only to be in line with the trend of the Education Reform but also to cater for students' learning diversity. It offers an academic program that allows for flexibility in classroom organization, curriculum and instruction to meet the different needs of students. In the past two years, the College has been advocating, as one of its major concerns, the use of information technology for student-centered learning. We believe information technology is a powerful tool to arouse students' curiosity for knowledge, to maintain a longer attention span and to encourage more discussion and expression of ideas in classrooms. Resources have been allocated to ensure the infrastructure such as WIFI is well built to meet the challenges. Class size has been reduced in many classes to allow more group discussion and use of technology. After the reduction of class size, is commonly used in classrooms for teaching and learning. To help students acquire IT skills, the College integrates IT instruction into different subjects such as Integrated Humanities, English, Chinese, Mathematics, Integrated Science, Health and Physical Education and Visual Arts in junior forms. Besides, teachers use videos to record students' SBA assessment.

We believe there is a greater need in the future for the use of technology in teaching and learning. And Campus TV can provide an additional platform for sharing of teaching experiences among teachers and students' self-learning. We can fully utilize different teaching resources from Campus TV such as video, multimedia package and internet resources.

2.2 Create a better environment to strengthen students' bi-literate and trilingual abilities

As a school using English as the medium of instruction, the College has always been creating an English-rich environment that maximizes students' use and exposure to English on campus. As for Putonghua, in junior form, Chinese language is taught in Putonghua while non-Chinese speaking students (about 20%) take Chinese as a second language and use Putonghua for lessons as well. To enhance their abilities, many students are encouraged to join the Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival every year and win lots of prizes. Not only are English and Putonghua used in classroom settings, but also are they used in non-teaching activities. The assemblies are conducted in English and Putonghua providing opportunities for students to build up more confidence in using the languages. Besides, the College's English and Chinese debate teams also actively take part in different kinds of competitions giving students who have talents in these areas good training and experience.

We believe with the establishment of a well-equipped Campus TV, students' performance can be recorded and uploaded to the school website for further appreciation and reflection so as to encourage more participation in language related activities such as public speaking, drama and debate etc. These recordings can also be telecast during lunchtimes to acknowledge students' efforts and inspire others to participate in such activities that will benefit them on many levels.

2.3 Enhance students' social awareness and promote the value of care

The College's ethos of simplicity and modesty has endured since its establishment. The College provides a balanced and diverse school education that meets the different needs of our students, and helps them build up knowledge, values and skills for further studies and personal growth. It places great emphasis on developing students' moral and civic values and positive attitude towards life. The various teams under Student Affairs Committee such as Discipline Team, Guidance and Counseling Team, Careers and Guidance Team and Friday Morning Assembly Team organize many different kinds of activities every year to foster positive values in students. The last two lessons on every Friday afternoon are reserved for Personal Development Programs in which activities relating to moral and civic education and personal growth are conducted. Apart from that, the launch of Community Service Scheme few years ago has further externalized our moral education by providing students' opportunities to understand the needs of different people and show care and concern to them. Students are required to complete at least 15 community service hours each year. In the last two years, students completed for over 20,000 service hours and were given the "Caring School Award" by the Agency For Volunteer Service.

We believe that Campus TV can provide an additional platform and use interactive means to strengthen students' civic-consciousness, patriotism, moral awareness and willingness to contribute to the community. Activity and program reviews in video format will be produced to show students' achievements as well as to advocate positive values including the spirit of serving others. It can also help enhancing students' sense of belonging.

2.4 Need for live broadcast

The College has about 810 students and the school hall is not big enough to accommodate all the students during assemblies. Therefore, it is necessary to have live broadcast so that all students who cannot be accommodated in the school hall can enjoy the programs and activities.

Some other major events such as annual graduation ceremony, S1 admission talk also require live broadcast for guests who are not able to enter the hall. Campus TV will also record these events and store them in a video library for future use.

3. Campus TV as a part of the School Development Plan

3.1 Development of School-based curriculum

Campus TV will assist the production of different materials for teaching and learning of different academic subjects. For instance, to arouse students' interest in drama learning in English lessons, videos on Shakespeare's work can be used. Videos about Chinese culture, stories of authors, debate can be used in Chinese lessons to enhance students' ability in appreciating and using the language. Current affairs related videos can also be used for Liberal Studies and Economics lesson and documentaries for Chinese history and Geography lessons are found to be useful. For students learning CSL (Chinese as a second language), students can make videos about Putonghua learning. Video clips on sports and music can be used in PE and music lessons.

3.2 Develop of extra-curricular activities

The College provides a wide range of extra-curricular activities for students in order to explore and develop their potential. We believe that well-organized and meaningful activities can help students acquire knowledge and skills that cannot be easily delivered in a classroom setting. Groups and team activities can enrich students' social lives, enhance their communication skills and develop their leadership potential. Every year, students are encouraged to select one musical or one sports/interest group that interests them most. Campus TV can help to produce promotion videos as well as review activities for these clubs or groups. Students can also choose Campus TV group as one of their ECAs.

3.3 Development of moral and civic education and personal development

The College believes moral and civic education is as important as teaching knowledge. We have been dedicated to the development of our students to be caring individuals. Departments and teams have been organizing programs in lesson time or outside classrooms to arouse students' civic awareness. In addition, in the next 3-year-plan, "Character formation" will be one of the major concerns. This goal will be implemented at different levels. With the help of Campus TV, materials with visual aids for moral education and character building can be further developed to arouse students' interest in discussion and reflection. Highlights of activities such as community services can also be produced. It is hoped that through the broadcasts of these programs, students will continue to participate in voluntary work and develop positive attitudes and values towards life.

3.4 Development of multiple intelligences

Our school mission is to provide an all-round education for the total development of our students, encompassing moral, intellectual, physical, social and aesthetic aspects. With a well-equipped Campus TV studio, the school can produce more programs related to sports, arts and music. Besides, we believe that every student has talent in different areas, Campus TV can help to develop every participating student to

his/her full potential. Video is an art form and a way of expressing ideas and feelings. Students can experience the flow of video production (planning, filming, editing and broadcasting) and use it as a means of self-expression.

3.5 Development of reading scheme

The College has always been promoting reading as part of students' self-learning. There are two libraries in the campus with a good collection of books. Apart from other reading schemes, the Campus TV can help producing programs introducing new books and recommending good books by teachers and students.

3.6 Development of closer relationship between the College and parents

The College organizes various kinds of activities for parents ranging from parent-child community service, to parents seminar and workshops and to form parents' meetings etc. The College works closely with the Parent Teacher Association which is becoming more and more active. Campus TV will continue to interview parents to share their parenting skills, assist the PTA to develop their webpage and video archives and allow parents to know more about their children's school life from programs it produces.

4. Readiness for project implementation

4.1 Infrastructure and Human Resources ready

Our school has already assigned a special room as Campus TV Studio. There is no need to renovate the room as a result of this project. If any further changes of room will be needed for the expansion of campus TV station in the future, the school will comply with the relevant procedures and legislation. Besides, we will continue to use the existing facilities in the room after the implementation of the project together with the new equipment funded by the QEF. Other than using them in production of programs, they can also be used for student training (e.g. students from the campus TV team). We have a team of teachers and IT staff with sufficient knowledge and skills in building and operating Campus TV Studio. A number of programs have been produced in the last few years. Teachers and IT staff have acquired a certain level of experience and skills in video production.

4.2 Establishment of Campus TV ECA

Campus TV ECA was started in our school ten years ago. One of the goals of this ECA is to train a group of students to become student reporters. The Campus TV ECA has produced a certain number of programs in the past few years and these student reporters have already acquired a certain level of skills in reporting and video production. From the increasing number of students joining this ECA, we can tell that many students have strong interest in this area. However, the development is yet limited by the lack of resources. With a better equipped Campus TV, students will have a better environment to develop their potential in video production to the fullest.

4.3 Live broadcast of morning assemblies

Our school has been doing live broadcast of morning assemblies for a number of years already. However, the quality of the broadcast is less than satisfactory due to hardware and technology constraints. With the new Campus TV Studio, live broadcasts can be of a much better quality.

4.4 Information Technology Development in School

The school has been committed to using information technology to enhance teaching and learning, the students can learn better in an active and student-centered learning environment. In the year 2011, our school already started using and computer in teaching and learning. Every classroom is equipped with teaching computers, projectors, other digital devices and the fiber-optic network, The fiber network backbone has been upgraded to 1Gbps speed, which is a high-volume data transmission to deal with the future growing multimedia teaching and "Campus TV" broadcast needs. If we can get funding for the establishment of the Quality Education Fund "Campus TV", with the updated equipment together with the original school IT facilities the school's information technology education will make great progress and have a better impact on teaching and learning.




7. Involvement of teachers and school management in the project

Campus TV Team was established to provide support to the College in limited scales. We keep video records of most of the official functions, activities and services held by the College, give audio-visual assistance to the College whenever necessary, and serve as a means of communication between the College and the students.

With sufficient funding to expand its capacity, Campus TV is composed of 5 teacher advisors and student members. Student members are further divided into program managers and crew members. Each program manager is responsible for the production of a particular program under the supervision of the teacher advisors.



This project will be implemented under the supervision and monitoring of the Assistant Principal (Student Affairs). It will be implemented by the Campus TV Team and IT Team.

Note:

(1) A2 Power VR Presenter x 1 set:

The existing old video mixer has been used for 10 years. It can only support analog signal but does not support HD input and output. It does not support the new video cameras currently used. Besides, some of the functions can no longer be used.

(2) A3 & A4 LED TV x 2 set

The school is currently using only one TV, which was purchased 10 years ago, for both preview and main out. It is not working efficiently as switching between the two functions is needed. Apart from that, it can only support analog signal but not the HD input and output. Thus, two new TVs are needed to perform two different functions efficiently.

(3) A13 Video management software x 1 set

The college does not have any video management software. The new software will be used to archive video files for future usage.

(4) A15 Video editing software x 1 set

This existing editing software was purchased 10 years ago. It does not support the new video format commonly used nowadays. Moreover, the College is introducing more IT technology for teaching and learning. More devices have been acquired for teachers and students to use in classrooms and for extended learning. For instance, all students need to learn how to make e-books since last year. More advanced software will be needed to edit videos that are to be included in e-books.

11. Extension of the benefits from the project

- v. Programs produced will be uploaded to the school webpage and be viewed by students and parents at home. This can help extending students' learning to home and allow parents to better understanding their children's learning and life at school. Some of the programs can also be part of the new teaching strategy "flipped classroom" to enhance teaching and learning.
- vi. The achievement from the project can be shared with other schools (The college is planning to work together with the primary schools or organizations in the district, those from humble background in particular) and the community.

- ii. The College will take part in QEF promotion activities.
