Activities in this project enable students to experience and learn the aesthetic and technology elements of music making and recording. Students learn to develop their potentials through hand-on experiences in managing the studio. They would be able to understand their own strengths and weaknesses, enhancing their aesthetic sense and developing their interpersonal and social skills.
