1. Support Service Co-ordinator

2. Areas of Collaboration

Curriculum development and learning and teaching of values education in kindergartens

3. Foci of Development

QTN co-ordinator will support teachers of participating schools to promote and develop values education at schools. The foci of development are as follows:

- To encourage schools to promote positive education and culture so as to cultivate a positive attitude among children towards learning and life
- To assist schools to strengthen school-family partnership to foster whole-person development of children by optimising teaching and enhancing teacher's professional capacity
- To promote professional sharing through networking different schools for capacity building of teachers and schools, which will establish a professional school network

4. Modes of Exchange and Collaboration

On-site support and network activities: QTN co-ordinator will support and collaborate with teachers of participating schools regularly for one school year through the followings:

- school leader and teacher workshops
- regular on-site visits
- establishing a "positive schools network"
- district and school-based parent workshops
- Positive Leadership training
- professional learning communities

5. Expectations on Participating Schools

To make good use of the support services, participating schools are expected to:

- be open and receptive to external professional support
- have commitment in developing positive education and whole-person development in school culture

provide administrative facilitation such as arranging time for discussion, collegial module planning

and peer classroom observations

• upload the case of school-based positive education development to the project website for sharing

with project schools

• establish a learning portfolio showing project progress and reflections for knowledge management

and experience sharing

• be willing to share with teachers within and outside schools for building professional learning

community

• observe strictly their legal obligations, in all cases, and comply with Copyright Ordinance in

developing school-based experience sharing materials

6. Points to Note

• The support services normally last for one year

• Active engagement of participating schools throughout the support services is expected

• All participating schools should form a core project team of at least 2 to 3 teachers and assign one

teacher-in-charge to be responsible for the liaison of QTN activities

At least one representative should attend each QTN activity

• Principal or school representative of participating schools are required to attend two Executive

Committee (EC) meetings and an annual dissemination seminar to share the good practices derived

and challenges faced
