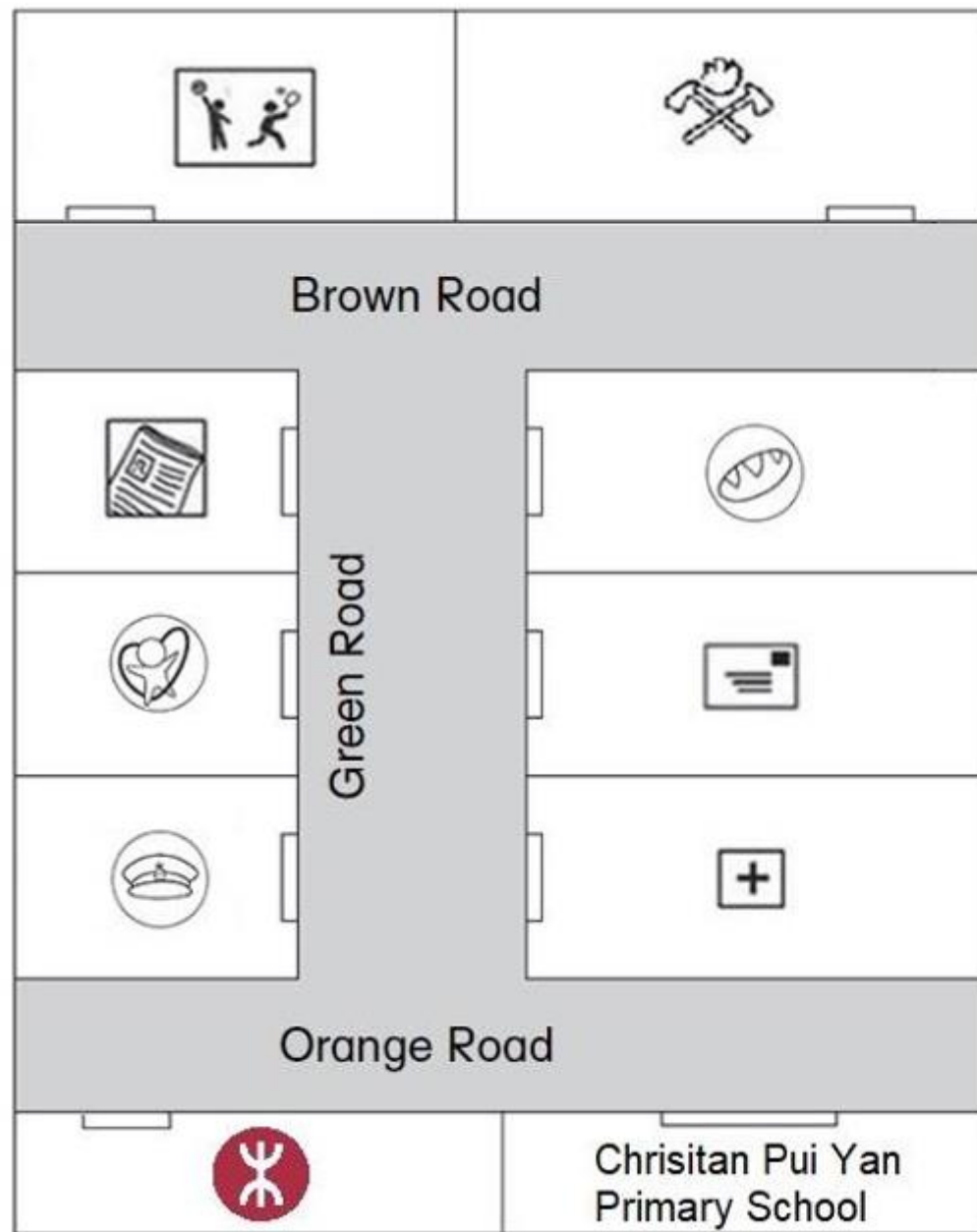

You're my best friend at school. I really hope you can help me. Write back soon.

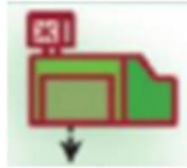
