3. Objectives

The project aims:

- to enhance students' self-directed learning ability by promoting Assessment as Learning in a school-based curriculum

4. Foci of Support

- To assist participating schools in setting learning objectives and developing Chinese Language curriculum (e.g. process writing and innovative education)
- To introduce suitable learning and teaching strategies and tools (e.g. movies, picture books and board games) based on students' learning needs, interests and abilities
- To guide teachers to design learning-teaching-assessment materials and strategies through e-learning platforms so as to enrich students' learning experiences, arouse their interests in learning and scaffold their learning
- To enhance teachers' professional capacity in making use of assessment data to feedback students on their strengths and weaknesses in learning with a view to promoting students' continuous development

5. Modes of Support

- To conduct lesson study including collaborative lesson planning, lesson observation and post-lesson discussion
- To use Cloud platforms to share resources and communicate with the participating schools
- To conduct open lesson and workshops
- To guide teachers to design learning and teaching activities, learning and teaching materials, assessment tasks and follow-up activities after assessment, etc.

6. Expectations on Participating Schools

• Participating schools nominate one teacher-in-charge to liaise with the support team and the related Curriculum Support Officer

- Participating schools arrange regular timeslots for teachers concerned to attend meetings and participate in various professional development activities, e.g. collaborative lesson planning
- Participating schools attend two Executive Committee (EC) meetings and an annual dissemination seminar to share the good practices generated and effective ways to cope with challenges encountered
- Participating teachers share with other teachers their experiences in school-based curriculum development and the materials and resources they develop, e.g. work plans, learning and teaching materials, research reports and student work.
