Hands & Brains-on: Promoting STEAM Education and Applying HOTS (High Order Thinking Skills) in General Studies

### 1. Objectives

The project aims:

- to assist participating schools in promoting STEAM education in General Studies so as to facilitate the connection among the Science, Technology, Arts and Mathematics Education Key Learning Areas (KLAs)
- to assist teachers in designing hands-on and brains-on STEAM education activities so as to enhance students' ability in integrating and applying knowledge and skills in different KLAs
- to assist participating schools in promoting HOTS (High Order Thinking Skills) in General Studies
- to assist participating schools to cultivate positive values of students through STEAM education

# 2. Foci of Support

- To introduce the STEAM education framework, curriculum content and related learning activities of the network co-ordinating school
- To assist participating schools in activating or developing STEAM education, designing school curriculum, science and technology inquiry activities and planning subject-based and cross-curricular STEAM Education plans through regular workshops and onsite support activities
- To assist participating schools in designing STEAM-related project learning activities with one school level as a starting point

#### 3. Modes of Support

- To provide onsite support and conduct lesson study including collaborative lesson planning, lesson observation and post-lesson discussion
- To conduct networking activities such as open lesson, workshops and sharing session

#### 4. Points to note

- The duration of the support services normally lasts for one year
- Participating teachers are interested in school curriculum design and keen on promoting STEAM education
- Participating schools nominate one teacher-in-charge to liaise with the support team and the related Curriculum Development Officer
- Participating schools arrange regular timeslots for teachers concerned to attend meetings and participate in various professional development activities, e.g. collaborative lesson planning
- Participating schools attend two Executive Committee (EC) meetings and an annual dissemination seminar to share the good practices generated and effective ways to cope with challenges encountered
- Participating teachers share with other teachers their experiences in school curriculum development and the materials and resources they develop, e.g.

- work plans, learning and teaching materials, research reports and student work. (The copyright of these materials will be owned by the Quality Education Fund.)
- Participating schools should comply with relevant laws, such as compliance with the Copyright Ordinance in developing school-based learning and teaching materials
